Steven M. Podos, MD

Steven M. Podos, MD (1937-2009), was a brilliant and visionary physician-scientist, consummate teacher and mentor, and world-renowned glaucoma specialist. For 30 years (1975-2005), Dr. Podos served as Chair of the Department of Ophthalmology at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. His many academic accomplishments included serving as Editor-in-Chief of Investigative Ophthalmology and Visual Science and Executive Vice President of the Association of University Professors of Ophthalmology (AUPO). The recipient of many prestigious awards and accolades, Dr. Podos was honored with the Alcon Research Institute's establishment of the annual Steven Podos Keynote Lecture.

A New York City native, Dr. Podos graduated Summa Cum Laude from Princeton University and earned his medical degree from Harvard Medical School. Serving as Chief Resident, he received his ophthalmology training at Washington University School of Medicine, and spent 2 years at the National Institutes of Health. Prior to his appointment as Chair of Ophthalmology at Icahn Mount Sinai, Dr. Podos served as faculty for 6 years at Washington University, promoted to the rank of Professor of Ophthalmology during that time.
