Course Description

This is a one day in person conference on home dialysis sponsored by the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. Practitioners, researchers, clinician-scientists and RNs who are experts in the field of kidney disease will discuss current developments in the field of Peritoneal Dialysis and related dialysis modalities. There will be a variety of topics, including roundtable discussion with dietician and patients on PD on ways to overcome the challenges faced by patients in managing their nutrition.

Conference Objectives

- Review the physiology of peritoneal membrane, summarize the best practices to preserve the performance of the membrane and review the role of adequacy testing.
- Discuss the challenges and strategies to improve nutrition in PD patients.
- Examine and discuss the risks and benefits of Urgent start PD and strategies to help patients switch between home modalities if the need arises.
