

FUNDAMENTALS OF POINT OF CARE ULTRASOUND

COURSE DESCRIPTION: The course is designed to educate and review the basic and advanced principles of bedside POCUS via hands on lab experience. In addition, the course will provide instruction on the use of ultrasound for Vascular Access and Musculoskeletal Joint Injection. The curriculum has been set up to provide each participant the opportunity to review pathology via imaging interpretation ---- participant to faculty ratio of 3:1.
