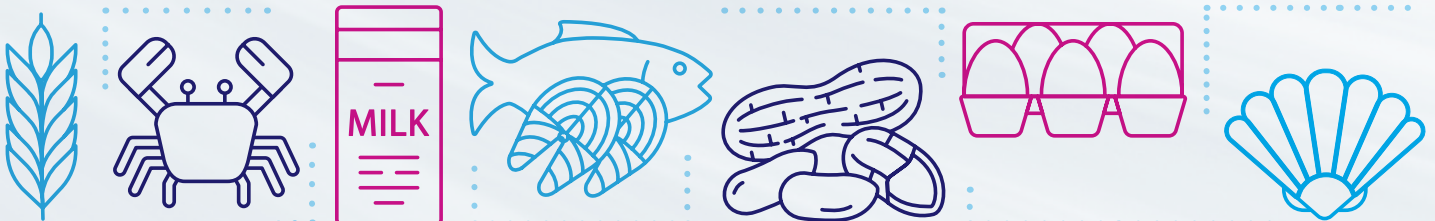

Course Description
