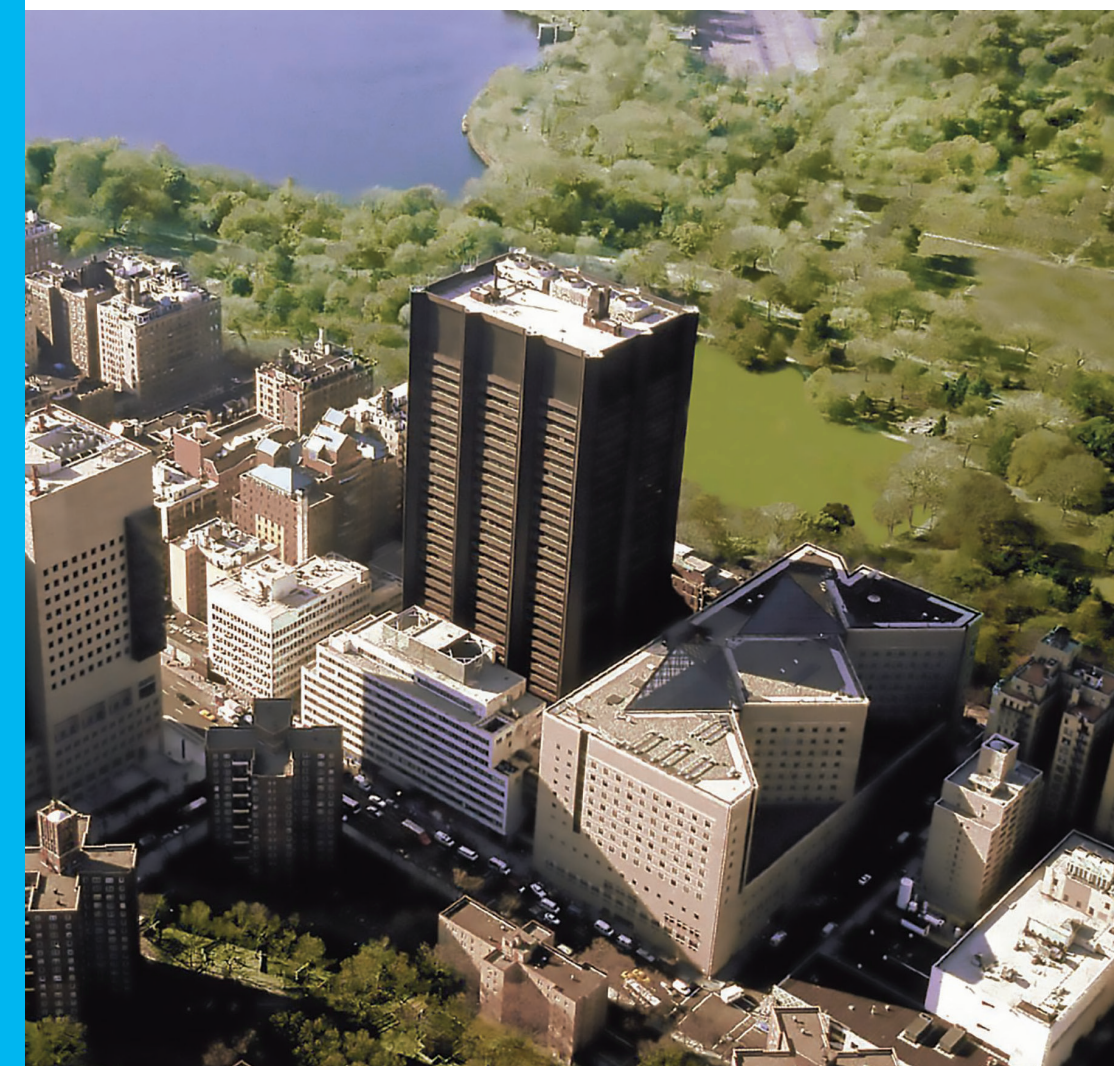

Program Goals

The 19th Annual Mount Sinai Inflammatory Bowel Disease Consultant's Course will provide an in-depth review of strategies for participants to better diagnose, classify and achieve remission in patients with Inflammatory Bowel Diseases. State-of-the-art lectures will be given by expert faculty on optimizing therapies, innovative treatment, and epidemiology of IBD. This onsite activity and live webinar will confront challenging clinical scenarios such as IBD Mimickers, GI Bleeds, and Extraintestinal Manifestations of IBD. The goal is to meet the need of our IBD patients by addressing sub-optimal disease control, preventable disease complications, and potential negative consequences of therapy.

Case-based discussions and debates will be held. The goal is to help IBD caregivers and physicians meet the needs of our IBD patients by addressing sub-optimal disease control, preventable disease complications, and potential negative consequences of therapy such as serious infections and cancer.

The Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai course directors have selected experts in this field to lend their expertise to highlight the latest advances in the treatment of a disease that affects about 1.6 million people in the US. There will be many opportunities for audience interaction and participation at this year's course.

Program Objectives

At the conclusion of the conference, the participants will be able to:

- Describe the use and adverse events associated with ozanimod, risankizumab, and upadacitinib.
- Describe treatment options for special populations including pregnant patients and patients with penetrating sequelae.
- Describe appropriate implementation of therapeutic drug monitoring and treat-to-target approaches in clinical practice.
- Identify the rationale for positioning of biologic therapies for Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis.
