GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

- Understand the underlying mechanism leading to Turner syndrome and review worldwide clinical guidelines for the care of children and young women with Turner syndrome.
- Understand the pathogenesis of type 1 diabetes mellitus and be aware of clinical evidence based advances in targeted prevention strategies for type 1 diabetes mellitus.
- Identify the underlying etiologies of rickets, especially X-Linked Hypophosphatemia and learn about new targeted therapy for this form of rickets.
