COURSE DESCRIPTION

Advances in Pulmonary Medicine is presented by the faculty of the Icahn School of Medicine's Division of Pulmonary, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine and the Mount Sinai-National Jewish Health Respiratory Institute. CME and MOC points are offered, targeting community pulmonologists, primary care physicians, hospitalists, and physician extenders interested in the care of patients with common and complex pulmonary disorders. Major topics in Pulmonary medicine will be reviewed with emphasis on diagnosis, new treatments and guidance on referral to quaternary care centers for an array of pulmonary disorders found in the ambulatory and inpatient setting. New evidence based therapies will be reviewed and discussed. Didactic sessions will be complemented by panel discussions, lunch-time small group learning sessions, meet the professor small groups, point of care testing demonstrations, and will conclude with a Keynote Lecture on Oxygen Supplementation and a late breaking session on the COVID-19 pandemic.
