### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

We are ditching the PowerPoint! This CME activity is an exciting series of live, interactive conversations between expert imagers and expert surgeons and interventionalists.

Each conversation will be followed by a clinical case and an extended Question and Answer session.

- Understand how best to image the lesion to guide the proceduralist before, during, and after the intervention.
